Let's have a look at some of the amazing work that has been uploaded to Google Classroom!





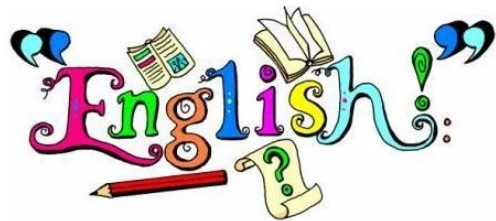
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In Art, Year 5 learnt about the famous artist John Constable. Look at Mirela's amazing piece of art in the style of John Constable. Brilliant!



Above, is Frankie's art in the style of Banksy. Incredible!



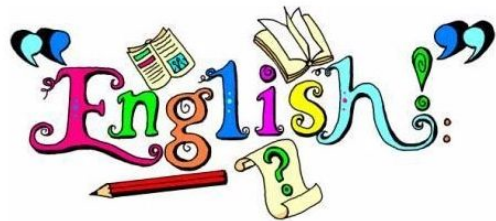

"Erm...hello," said Ruby quietly, "we are here to collect a skateboard?"

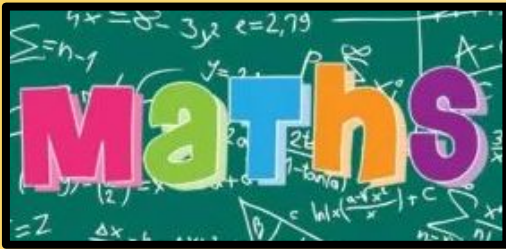

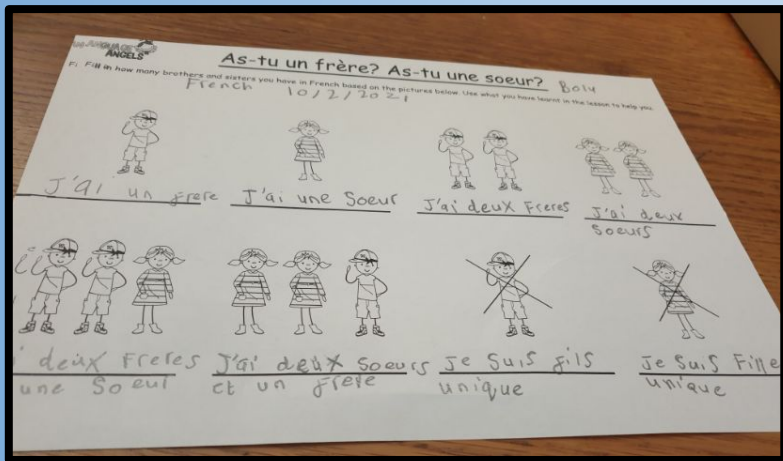

Aden did a skittles experiment using hot water. Skittles were placed around the edge of the plate and then hot water was poured in the middle. The colours look hypnotising!



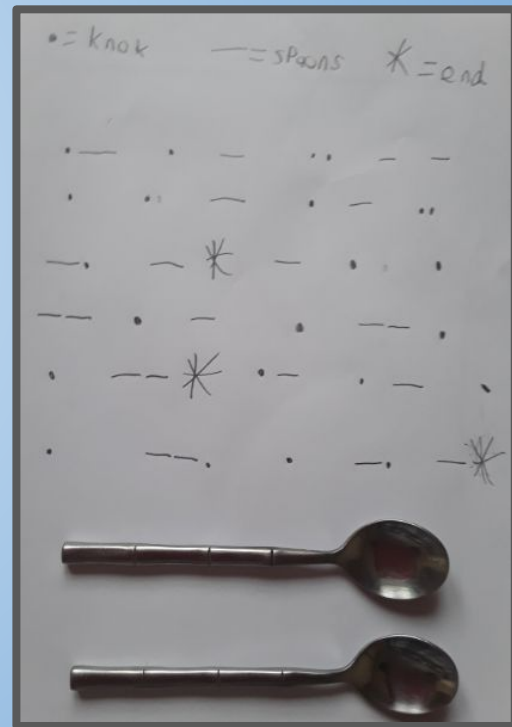
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Bolu created an amazing piece of French learning all about brothers and sisters! Well done, Bolu!



Another amazing piece of work from Frankie. Have a go at following his instructions in music!





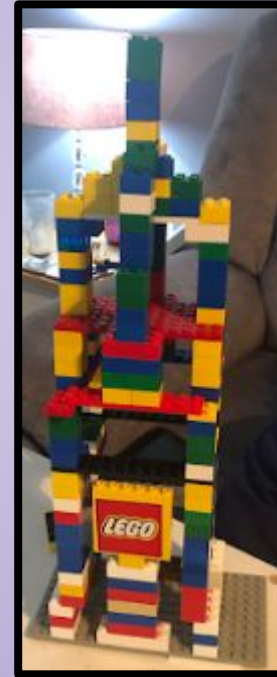
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For Design and Technology, we asked Year 5 to replicate The Eiffel Tower. Have a look at how creative they were!



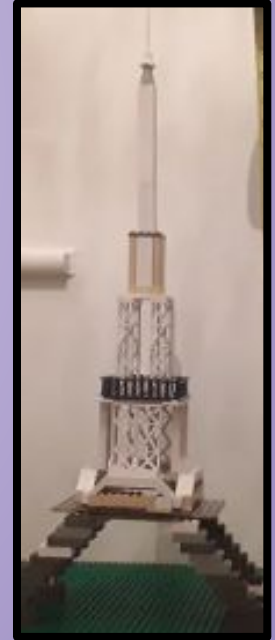
