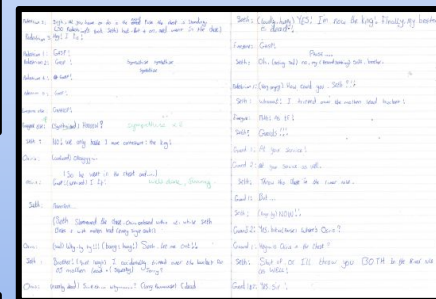
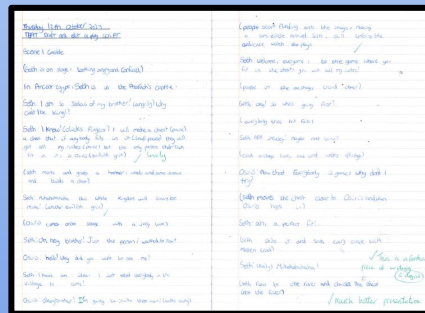
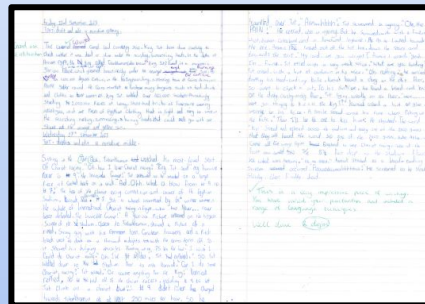
READING

In our reading lessons, the children have been thoroughly enjoying the adventures of Jake Atlas and his sister Pan as they attempt to find their missing parents in Egypt.

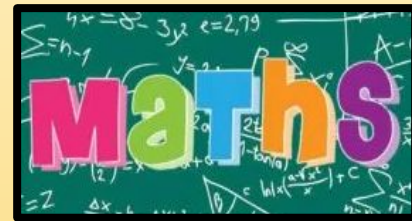
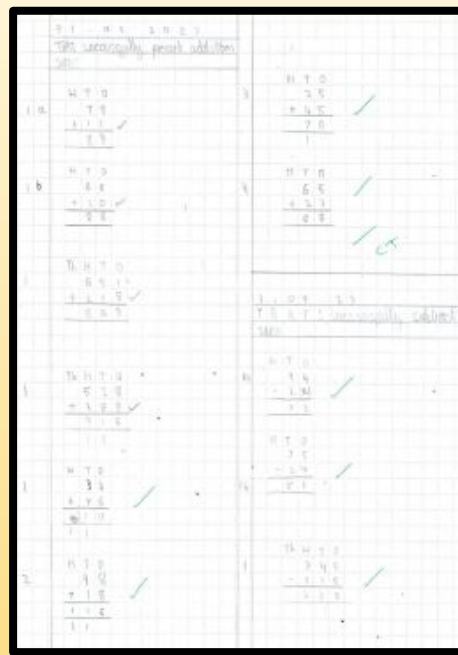
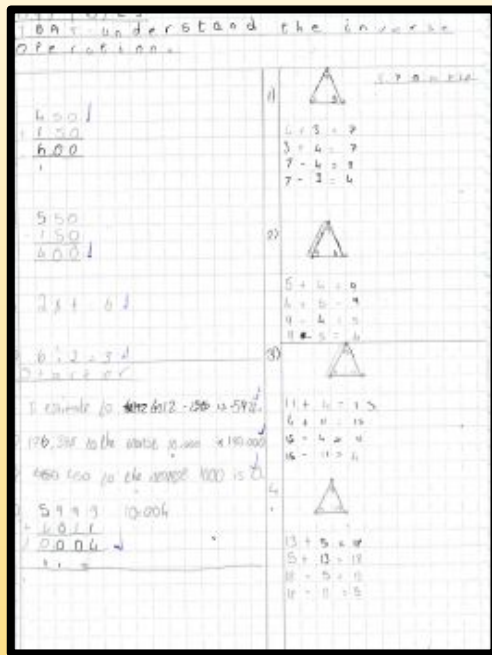
They will continue to read this book in Term 2.

This term, Year 5 have been learning all about electrical circuits.

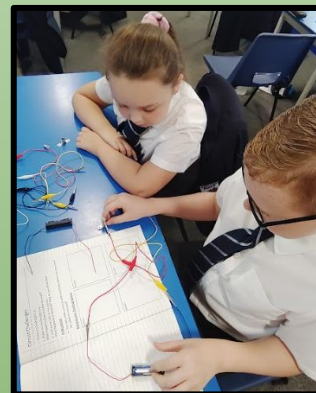
They have been looking at the components needed to create a working electrical circuit, as well as the symbols needed to draw them.

As a school, we have been exploring drawing within our Art weeks this term.

The children have learnt drawing techniques such as cross hatching, shading, variation of lines and looking at pattern. They have been using various mediums including charcoal, biro pens and their favourite which was their new artist pencils.

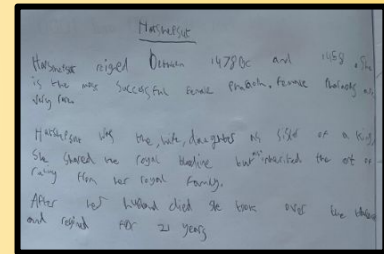
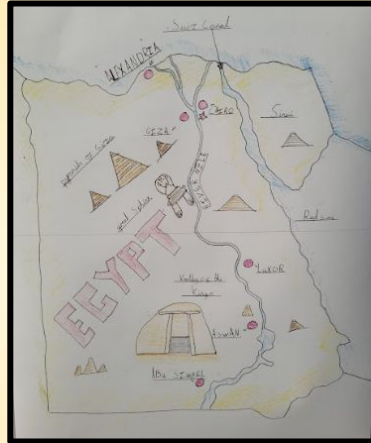
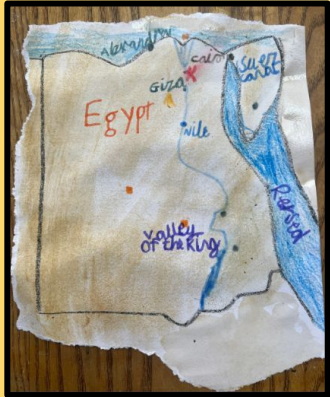

Lots of fun was had by children and their adults!


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HOME LEARNING
