Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Year 1 in term 2! We are so looking forward to this term and learning about our wonderful world during autumn!

Below are the topics that we will be studying in Autumn Term 2.

Theme	All About Autumn
Subject	
English - Texts related to our autumn theme	The children have daily phonics sessions to develop their understanding of phonics, their ability to spell and to develop reading skills. The children also have a text-based lesson where they share ideas, build their vocabulary and practice their writing skills. Our key learning in phonics is to: sound out; form letters correctly; say and then write a sentence or sentences!
Mathematics	Counting forwards and backwards; Addition & Subtraction; 2D shapes and place value within 20.
Science	Seasonal change- looking at differences in the environment around them. Exploring the changes within autumn and winter. Collecting data and investigating changes in seasonal weather.
Computing	Controlling a robot; Using getepic.com ; oxfordowl.co.uk ; numbots.com
Freeflow	Learning across the subjects based around our seasonal theme of Autumn
R.E.	This term we will be having our RE day in December, learning about the Christmas story in the morning and Islamic symbols in the afternoon.
P.S.H.E.	Using the Jigsaw scheme - 'celebrating differences- identify similarities between people in our class, developing relationships and trying to solve problems.
P.E	Real PE adventures - help, praising and encourage others in their learning; work sensibly with others, taking turns and sharing; agility and balance
Music	Using the Charanga music scheme to explore sounds and follow a beat; rapping; rhythm games

Homework in Year 1:

Maths at home - numbots.com

Maths learning is always fun while playing numbots. Your child will receive an individual login to use the site, play games, practice and develop numeracy skills whilst collecting stars and coins to spend on robot body parts to create a super Numbot!

Home Reading

Our reading system gives you the chance to share a book with your child, allows us to carry out focus group work and also ensures your child has an individually matched book. Here's how it works:

On Mondays: your child will bring home a **Sharing Book** to enjoy together - this is not matched to your child's reading level - it is for listening to and sharing together. This is returned the following Wednesday.

On Wednesdays: your child will bring home a **Group Reading Book** following a group session with the teacher. This is matched specifically to your child's level, however your child will have discussed and begun to read this book with the teacher in a small group prior to bringing it home to read to you. This is returned the following Friday.

On Fridays: your child will bring home a **Home Reading Book** also matched specifically to your child's level. Support your child to read this text as normal, encourage them to use their phonics skills to decode words but also help them out by telling them words which cannot be sounded out (for example 'the'). This is returned the following Monday.

It is still essential to sign in your child's Home School Contact Book whenever they have read. This can still include any reading books from home as well as school books. They will get a new Sharing, Group and Home Reading Book each week. Of course, it is also **essential** that all books are returned at the correct time - otherwise there won't be enough Sharing books for each child or there might not be enough Group Reading Books for each child in a group. It is best to ensure that your child brings their book bag daily as they are checked daily and it is easier when things go home like letters or completed work.

According to our Covid arrangements all books are cleaned and quarantined before being used again.

Get Epic

Each class has a Get Epic reading account. Teachers can see how much your child has read, which books and even if they have skipped through pages. Please go to <https://www.getepic.com/sign-in> and choose the class code for your child:

As your child progresses in phonics, they may bring additional phonics work home to support their learning based on their level and group in phonics.
