School Uniform

We are very proud of our school and all of our children and would like your help in ensuring that we keep the children looking smart as we go into the summer term. Having a smart uniform helps children take pride in their school and fosters a sense of community along with helping children to feel equal.

Our uniform can be purchased from Eastenders and Forsters in the high street and local supermarkets also sell the plain tshirt, jumpers and PE kits. We would also like to remind you that we have a pop up shop once a term. These are advertised via WEDUC and on posters around the school.

Please note:

- For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery other than **small stud earrings**. These must be removed by the child prior to taking part in PE lessons (please note that adults cannot assist with this). If your child comes to school with small hoops, we will ask them to remove them or you will be called/ spoken to at the end of the school day.
- Hair ties should be either plain black or dark blue. Large bows or other ornamental hair pieces should not be worn to school. Children will be asked to remove them if they are worn.
- No make-up should be worn at school and this includes nail varnish.
- Children should not bring mobile phones into school. However, in exceptional circumstances, such as a child walking
 to and from school alone, permission should be sought by the class teacher. Mobile phones must then be switched
 off and handed into class teachers, who will then lock them away for the day and give them back to your
 son/daughter at the end of the day.



Following recent incidents, we are having zero tolerance for abusive language and swearing. If a child uses language that is not acceptable, they will miss a break time and parents/carers will be informed at the end of the school day. If this does not have an impact and children continue to use unacceptable language, they will be put on a school report that will be reviewed weekly in communication with parents/carers.
