


Term 4 in Year 5

We have continued to read Wonder this term. Children have been thoroughly engaged in the book and how Auggie's life and adventures have played a part in him becoming the boy he is.








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


We celebrated World Book Day and all came dressed in as book characters.
Children embraced the day and competed in a variety of activities throughout the whole week. All children had great fun and the love of reading only grew and grew!








Sow, Grow and Farm

Children have produced a variety of lovely dishes including; pineapple upside down cake, garlic dough balls, biscuits and a healthy oaty breakfast muffin.


In forest school, children have been able to make forts out of pallets, made dolls with clay and sticks and finished the term off by making smores!
