If you receive any of these:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

How we use Pupil Premium Funding

Pupil Premium Funding is the money we receive for all pupils who are entitled to free school meals, whose parents are in the Forces, or who are looked after by the Local Authority.

We use this money to:

- Buy new resources for your children
- Help towards the cost of school trips, including the Year 6 residential trip
- Employ extra teachers and teaching assistants to provide extra tuition for pupils who require extra support
- Pay for specialist staff such as a play therapist,
- Free milk for eligible children
- Personalised support for families
- Free freshly cooked school meals- every day, or once a week, or even just Christmas dinner!
